UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH EXPERIENCE OPPORTUNITY

Participate in on-going transportation, emissions and health research projects at the Texas A&M Transportation Institute – the largest University-based transportation research institute in the country.

Each student will be paired with a research mentor.

Students create an independent research topic that builds on their mentor's project(s).

THIS PROGRAM COVERS, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO, THE FOLLOWING TOPICS:

- Transportation emissions and/or air quality modeling
- Assessment of exposures and health impacts
- Policy and decision making
- Land-use and urban planning
- Health impacts of alternative and emerging technologies

\$6,000 will be provided to support the student for ten weeks. The program will also provide housing for the duration of the program, as well as a \$1700 food allowance.
